It is traditionally held in Horse Guards Parade in Whitehall. An RAF flypast later goes over Buckingham Palace. In June The Queen celebrates her *Diamond Jubilee* when Her Majesty marks 60 years on the throne. Jubilee celebrations will be between 2-4 June. Events in London will include a diamond Jubilee Pageant – including a flotilla of 1,000 boats along the river Thames. Thousands of street parties will be held across the capital on the 3rd June. The UK government is planning a four day national holiday. To mark the event Greenwich will become a Royal London Borough.

EXERCISES
