Another popular tradition is picking flowers, and creating a May Day wreath, to hang on their doors. It is meant to bring people closer to nature.

In France, May Day is really a day off for its workers. French people like to give family and friends little sprigs, bouquets, or even whole plants of lily of the valley, for good luck. The more bell-like the flower, the better the luck.

In Germany, May Day is a trade union day. It is also when people dance around the Maypole. In Bavaria, a May Day tradition is Maypole climbing. This is when young men battle, to see who can climb to the top of the Maypole, the fastest. The task is made tougher by soaping it.

In the Czech Republic, May Day is a day for love. It is traditionally when lovers would come with flowers, to spend time on hills above cities together. It is when lovers kiss under a blooming cherry or birch tree. Tradition says, that a girl who is not kissed under it, would wither and die in 12 months.

On the eve of May Day, single men in Slovakia, and the Czech Republic, go into the wood to cut down a tall tree. They strip it and decorate it, with scarves, ribbons, and flowers, and erect it in the village square. It is guarded, as other men will come to steal it, as a form of village competition. If your Maypole is not stolen, the unmarried girls in the village can be given little presents. In the evening, everyone celebrates at a ball.
