The new Model 3 will have a starting price of US\$35,000. However, it won't be available till the end of 2017. It can be ordered in many countries around the world including the UK, India, China and New Zealand. It will be Tesla's first mass produced electric car.

In the first two days alone pre-orders surpassed 276,000. Every car was secured by a deposit of US\$1,000 or similar in other currencies. Unlike deposits for iPhones, the Tesla deposits are fully refundable.

Following this huge wave of interest Musk tweeted that the company was "definitely going to need to rethink production planning". He added, "The future of electric cars is looking bright!" Musk would like to produce about 500,000 vehicles a year of the new Model 3.

The new vehicle will have a range of at least 346 kilometres (215 miles) per charge. A 15" landscape touchscreen will feature inside. Five adults will fit comfortably inside. The front to rear roof area will be a continuous piece of glass.

After just one week Tesla reported 325,000 deposits had been paid for the new Tesla Model 3. That's a whopping US\$14 billion in future sales. A Tesla statement said: "This is the biggest one-week launch of any product ever."
