Many Brazilians have been sceptical about these claims with thousands taking part in street protests, many of which turned into riots.

Many Brazilians have questioned the lavish spending on the new stadiums at the expense of schools and hospitals in a country beset with social inequality. Brazilians are right to doubt the economic benefits of hosting a World Cup.
